I didn't understand why he would say that. I ran out of the house and got a taxi home. I still love him and he loves me. He says it's because he loves me he won't tell the police about all the drugs I've taken. "

Emma's mother is a single mum and has just broken up with her live-in boyfriend of 5 months. She has two girls Emma and a younger child, Megan. She is now seeing someone but says it's not serious.
