Lesson Overview: Risky Pics



STRAND:	Safety	Lesson Duration: Variable up to 60 minutes, by agreement with centre staff, dependent on whether lesson is delivered as a whole, or in parts and how pupils respond.

LESSON:	Risky Pics	

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child enshrines children and young people's rights to be protected from abuse and exploitation. All children and young people are potentially at risk of being sexually abused. Schools have a central role to play in reducing this risk. By exploring the features of safe and healthy relationships, officers can help learners to develop the skills to identify potential risks, stay safe and seek help if needed.

The safer relationships lesson should be delivered as part of the school's PSE and sex and relationship education (SRE) programme. It should be consistent with the school's sex education policy and the agreed values framework for SRE. Ensure that the lesson is appropriate for the needs of learners in terms of their age, maturity, language/images used, and understanding required.

- Clearly outline the classroom agreement about confidentiality
- Class introductory activity Have you? statements
- Explain display the learning objectives and key words
- Whole class definition of sexting
- Play DVD part 1
- Group work activity using the send/delete template
- Play DVD part 2
- Class discussion to clarify the law regarding sexting
- Class board blast activity to identify that choices have consequences
- Plenary.

### **ACTIVITIES**

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### INTRODUCTION

- Ensure link with the previous lesson is explained.
- Agree Golden Rules.
- Clearly outline the classroom agreement about confidentiality.
- Whole class activity complete the stand up if activity.
- Explain display the learning objectives and key words.

### MAIN ACTIVITIES

- Whole class activity discuss the definition of sexting
- Show DVD extract (1.58 secs)
- In groups complete the send / delete exercise
- Class feedback
- Watch the second part of the DVD (6.36 secs)
- Whole class question time about sexting and the Law
- Group exercise to consider the social, emotional and legal consequences of sexting

### REVIEW/PLENARY

- As a whole class discussion reiterate the key objectives
- Discuss with the class who can they go to for help
