Psychoactive substances have not been properly tested to see how toxic they are to humans so there is no way of telling how a psychoactive drug will affect you, especially if taken along with alcohol or other drugs or medication. We know nothing about the medium or long term effects of using these drugs. Alongside the embarrassment of behaviour — other consequences could be risk taking (lying in the road, unprotected sex etc.)  They can cause anxiety, panic attacks, paranoia or even psychotic illnesses. Many are stimulants (uppers) which may stop you sleeping leaving you exhausted and depressed later on.  Many drugs can have negative effects on mental health.  Many people often say they feel 'headwrecked' after taking these drugs. Such arrests will show up in later years on an extended DSB check and any cautions or convictions will show on an ordinary DSB check and can affect job prospects, volunteering and travel.

Supplying controlled drugs includes giving them away as well as selling.
